The time spent was very fruitful and able to address several problems mainly with maintenance needs at the orphanage and visitors center.

- 1) The showers in the girl's dorm was in much need of repair
- 2) Due to high salt content in our water the copper pipe has become stopped up and therefore we must re-plumb the building with PVC pipe.
- 3) Where the lower roof joins the side of the building there needs to be a metal flange placed on the roof to keep water from leaking down interior walls. This has been an ongoing battle with much repair over the years.
- 4) Facial boards and soffit must be done on the visitor's center. This wasn't finished due to our departure to the border because of the cartel.
- 5) Doors on the hanger needs major repair.

While we were there, we got to spend some quality time with the kids at the orphanage. They are so precious and loved having us there to play games with them and give them some individual attention.
